Free Eye Checking Camp for People of the entire Kamargaon Locality



Workshop on Vermi Compost and Mushroom Development

On April 9, 2024, Kamargaon College organized a daylong workshop focused on Vermi Composting and Mushroom Development. This event aimed to enhance students' understanding of sustainable agricultural practices and promote innovative farming techniques. The workshop featured resource persons who are 6th-semester B.Sc. Agriculture students from Assam Agriculture University, Jorhat. The workshop focused on educating participants about the principles and practices of vermicomposting, introducing the techniques of mushroom cultivation as an alternative source of income and encouraging sustainable agricultural practices among students and the local farming community. The workshop commenced with an introductory session highlighting the importance of organic farming and waste management. The resource persons presented detailed insights into Vermicomposting and explained in detail vermicomposting process and its benefits for soil health. They also arranged demonstration of the materials required for setting up a vermicompost system and initiated Hands-on activity where participants engaged in creating small-scale vermicompost bins. Further, they discussed in detail about Mushroom Development and gave an overview of various mushroom species suitable for cultivation, with a focus on oyster and button mushrooms. They provided step-by-step guidance on the mushroom growing process, including substrate preparation, inoculation, and harvesting. Discussions were held on the nutritional benefits of mushrooms and their role in enhancing food security. The workshop was highly interactive, with participants encouraged to ask questions and share their experiences related to composting and mushroom cultivation. Group discussions facilitated knowledge sharing and stimulated interest in these sustainable practices. Thus, the workshop on Vermi Compost and Mushroom Development successfully provided valuable insights into sustainable agricultural practices. The participation of 74 students and other attendees from AAU not only enhanced the learning experience but also fostered a sense of community among aspiring agricultural professionals. 

Free Health Camp at Goroimari High School for the people of the greater Kamargaon College

Awareness cum Sensitization Programme on Girl Child and Physical Changes during Adolescence & Sexual Harassment and Legal provisions

The Women Cell and the IQAC organised a workshop on *Girl Child and Physical Changes during Adolescence & Sexual Harassment and Legal provisions on June 11, 2024* at Kamargaon Girls' High School, Golaghat. Focusing on critical issues affecting girl children, the event aimed to educate participants about the physical changes during adolescence and raise awareness about sexual harassment, alongside discussing relevant legal provisions. The basic objectives of the workshop were to inform students about the physical changes occurring during adolescence, discuss the implications of these changes in the context of personal health and social interactions and raise awareness about sexual harassment and empower students with knowledge of their legal rights. The workshop began with an introductory address by the organizers, highlighting the importance of understanding both physical and emotional changes during adolescence. In Session 1 on *Physical Changes During*

Mrs. Ankita Kalita led the first session, discussing the biological changes that occur during puberty, emotional and psychological aspects of adolescence and the significance of self-care and health awareness during this transformative period. Interactive activities included Q&A sessions where students expressed their concerns and shared experiences, fostering a supportive environment. In session 2 on Sexual Harassment and Legal Provisions Ms. Shamima Khanom Juna facilitated the second session, which covered definitions and examples of sexual harassment, the impact of harassment on mental health and educational pursuits and legal rights and provisions available to victims of sexual harassment, including relevant laws and support systems. The session encouraged students to speak up against harassment and provided practical advice on how to seek help. The workshop was wellreceived, with active participation from students. Many expressed gratitude for the information shared, noting that it empowered them to understand and navigate their adolescent years more confidently. The resource persons emphasized the importance of open communication with trusted adults regarding any issues faced. The workshop, in short, provided valuable insights into both the physical and emotional aspects of adolescence while addressing the pressing issue of sexual harassment. The collaboration between Kamargaon College and Kamargaon Girls' High School proved effective in fostering a safe and informative environment for young girls.

Awareness cum Sensitizing programme on Menstrual Hygiene and Girl Child at Mohuramukh High School

A workshop cum awareness programme on menstrual hygiene was conducted at Mohuramukh Higher Secondary School in Golaghat on June 15, 2024. The workshop was organized by the Women Cell in collaboration with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). The workshop aimed to educate and empower girl students about menstrual hygiene, break taboos surrounding menstruation, and promote health awareness. Through the workshop cum awareness programme, efforts were made to provide information on menstrual hygiene management, raise awareness about the importance of menstrual health, discuss myths and misconceptions related to menstruation and equip students with practical knowledge and skills for maintaining menstrual hygiene. The workshop was attended by 435 students from various grades, along with faculty members and representatives from the Women Cell and IQAC. In the inaugural session, Principal of Mohuramukh Higher Secondary School spoke briefly about the workshop and welcomed the Resource Persons namely Mrs. Mousumi Sinha, specialist for Mental Health, VKNRL, Golaghat and Dr. Karabi Saikia, doctor, VKNRL, Golaghat. The workshop included Presentation on menstrual hygiene, covering topics such as the menstrual cycle, hygiene practices, and the use of menstrual products and discussions of common myths and cultural stigmas associated with menstruation were held in the workshop. The event also comprised a practical demonstration on the use of sanitary products, including pads and menstrual cups. In the Q & A session, students raised queries related to menstrual hygiene, asked questions and shared their experiences. The workshop fostered an environment where students felt comfortable discussing menstruation and related issues and the participants gained a better understanding of the importance of maintaining menstrual hygiene for their health and well-being. It also helped in increasing awareness of the societal taboos and challenges faced by girls during menstruation and encouraging students to advocate for change. At the end of the workshop, Participants expressed gratitude for the knowledge shared and appreciated the opportunity to discuss issues that are often considered taboo. Many participants indicated a desire for follow-up sessions to further explore women's health topics.
