Field Trip to Charaideo Maidam from Department of History and Philosophy, Kamargaon College, Golaghat

On 6th of April, 2024, total 39 numbers of students of department of History and department of Philosophy along with the faculty members of Kamargaon College undertook a field trip to Charaideo Maidam. Charaideo is a place of historical importance which is situated in Charaideo district, Assam, India. Charaideo was established by first Ahom king Chao Lung Siu-ka-Pha in the year 1253 C.E. as the first capital of the Ahom kingdom. Though the capital of the Ahom kingdom moved many times, Charaideo remained the symbolic center. It contains sacred burial ground of Ahom kings and Queens and is also the place of ancestral Gods of the Ahoms. The Charaideo Maidam, commonly known as the Pyramids of Assam, is the site of more than 90 royal burial mounds. The Centre has made the decision to submit this historic location for consideration as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Assam will have three world heritage sites if it is chosen, with Kaziranga National Park and Manas National Park being the other two.
