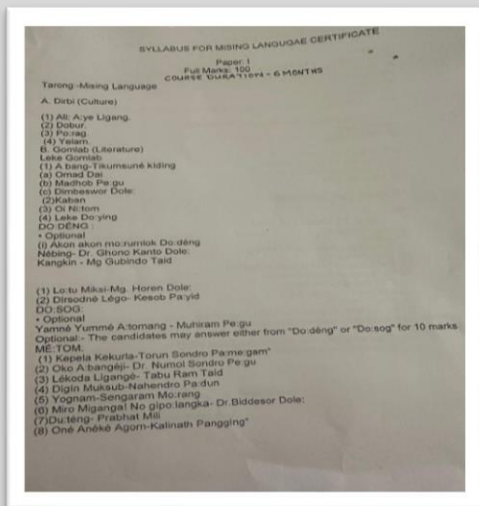

- No incomplete applications will be considered.
